We have seen war, famine, the 9-11 attack, and natural disasters. During Hurricane Isabelle we lost power for 7-10 days locally which was trying, but we adjusted and survived with minimal loss of life.

This coronavirus pandemic is unlike anything we have ever seen. It spreads very rapidly and has a high mortality rate. New York appears to be ground zero for our country. Our prayers are extended to them and other hot spots across the United States. The doctors, nurses, first responders, and other medical personnel are the true heroes of this time. It is unfortunate that they cannot get the essential supplies that they need. Many lives will be lost before cases begin to decline.

In times of natural disaster we have seen food and necessary items be in short supply and this time is no exception. To see bare shelves of produce, meats, bread, eggs, milk, water, bleach, disinfections, cleaners, paper towels, and toilet paper is truly extraordinary. Many of the above have been restocked from time to time, but the lack of disinfections, paper towels, and toilet paper seem constant.

Social distancing is a new, but quite effective, term in our vocabulary. The precautions that we have been given are not difficult, but they are quite an adjustment to our normal routines. These adjustments will be the new normal for many weeks. At this time please assist family and friends as needed. Follow precautionary guide lines and be safe at home.

The world and this country have survived pandemics and epidemics in the past and we will survive this one. We have always heard that the Lord works in mysterious ways and this is no exception. Stay strong and keep the faith.

AN EASTER MESSAGE FOR APRIL, 2020.

And Jesus said these words about himself: "I am the Alpha and the Omega; the First and the Last; the Beginning and the End. Behold, I died and yet, I am alive forever more ... and because I live, you will live also."

It is the breaking of dawn on April 12, 33 AD. In the garden where the tomb is located there is no one around. The guards have fled; the mourners in bed; the caretakers resting from their work. People are in their homes stretching and yawning and starting their breakfast meals. But in the garden, with the tombs, it is silent and lonely. There is no one to witness the event.

But the event happened anyways. The event that would change lives, produce hope, create a new living world by a complete understanding of God as love and grace. The event will become known as the resurrection of Christ. It happened with no one there to experience it. It happened at the dawn, in the silence, in stillness, all alone.

Yes, some women came sometime soon after and saw the remains of the resurrection. They saw the risen Jesus after he was resurrected, but the actual event itself? No one saw it. It happened at the dawn, in silence, in stillness, all alone.

And this is how we will discover it this year. We won't bring it in with singing choirs, loud praises, or a breakfast meal together. Like the first resurrection we will bring Easter Sunday in on silent angel wings while each separate person embraces the quiet dawn. This year we will experience it like the very first day of resurrection. On Easter Sunday, go out before the dawn breaks, face to the east and ponder and rejoice that, even though everything is different; even though everything is silent and empty – the event still happened. And it will forever happen. We don't bring in Easter, God does and nothing can stop it.
